LWVCEF State Study Committee Public Higher Education in California

Dear Presidents and/or Education Chairs,

In February, I emailed a letter to all League presidents and/or Education Chairs that contained information about the first Background Packet #1 related to our Study of Public Higher Education in California. I am happy to report that as of this date, thirty-three local Leagues have made the commitment to participate in our study. The goal, of course, is to have 100% of our Leagues participating as input from across our very diverse state is vital to the successful drafting of a League position statement.

As outlined in the February letter, updates with at least two articles related to the scope of the study will be posted around the 20<sup>th</sup> of each month on the study website (<a href="http://lwvc.org/study/education-0">http://lwvc.org/study/education-0</a>) and sent out electronically to League presidents and/or local committee chairs. Local education committee members should read and discuss the articles, as well as the suggested questions (or your own questions) related to the area, in order to develop and enhance their own knowledge base as a committee. At my League's first local education study committee meeting, the first two articles elicited strong opinions - both in agreement and disagreement! Data collection methods were also questioned. It was a very worthwhile discussion and a great start for our committee.

This second packet (Packet #2) of background information contains links to 3 short articles about the Master Plan for Higher Education in California and one very recent one about California's Future and Higher Education. Reading and discussing these articles, along with the two read last month, provide an important contrast between the state's need and/or economic benefits of a higher education versus the vision promoted in the Master Plan for Higher Education in California.

- 1. What significant historical factors led to the development of the Master Plan in 1960?
- 2. Why was it considered revolutionary? What evidence confirms that description?
- 3. Was it successful? What indicators confirm your opinion?
- 4. What significant aspects were addressed or added by later commissions?

- 3. Discuss the pros and cons regarding the steps suggested by the authors that the state should take to improve educational outcomes?
