

- Read explanations of ballot measures along with who supports, opposes, and funds them.
- Find out where, when, and how to vote, including local polling locations and vote centers.
- Keep track of your choices and save them for Election Day
- Access a Spanish language version of the website.

How does it work? Enter your **zip code** and your **street address** to access your complete ballot. Your address information is confidential. We are nonpartisan, nonprofit, and do not sell information. <u>Privacy policy.</u>
